Several of KI BOIS Community Action programs have expanded service areas. KI BOIS Area Transit System (KATS) serves Adair, Cherokee, Haskell, Hughes, Latimer, LeFlore, McIntosh, Okfuskee, Okmulgee, Pittsburg, Sequoyah and Wagoner Counties. KI BOIS Community Care serves Adair, Atoka, Bryan, Cherokee, Choctaw, Coal, Haskell, Hughes, Latimer, LeFlore, Marshall, McCurtain, McIntosh, Muskogee, Okfuskee, Okmulgee, Pittsburg, Pontotoc, Pushmataha, Sequoyah, and Seminole Counties.

For more than 40 years, countless numbers of lives have been touched through the many services offered by KI BOIS Community Action.

KI BOIS Community Action is administered by a thirty member Board of Directors, an Executive Director/CEO, Associate Director/CFO, Associate Director/COO, Program Directors and Coordinators.

Covering 5,055 square miles, the total population of the five counties is 162,535 (2010 census) persons. Of this total, 32,114 are below poverty income guidelines. KI BOIS Community Action provides employment for over 950 people and has an annual payroll of over \$20 million and a total budget of over \$35 million dollars, making KI BOIS Community Action one of the largest employers in Southeastern Oklahoma.

The following are some of the programs and services offered by KI BOIS Community Action Foundation, Inc.

KI BOIS Community Action provides information and referrals to people interested in furthering their education. Staff provides guidance and counseling for school age children and adults. KI BOIS Community Action also assists them in obtaining scholarships and grants to use for their education.

KI BOIS Community Action also has RSVP volunteers trained in Laubach to teach people how to read. If you need tutoring, call Marcia Mitchell, RSVP Director, in McAlester at (918) 423-3525 or (866) 213-4881.

The Sheltered Workshop staff works with individuals, assisting them in learning to read, write and learn daily living skills through the use of computers.

Head Start provides educational programs to parents and volunteers at Cluster Parent Meetings.



KI BOIS Head Start Program helps prepare pre-school children for the experience of school. The Head Start centers work to provide a variety of educational activities to help children grow mentally, socially, emotionally and physically. They also receive free medical and dental care, have healthy meals and snacks, and enjoy playing indoors and outdoors in a safe setting.

Head Start helps all children succeed. The children are involved in such activities as field trips, language development, music and science. Services are offered to meet the special needs of children with disabilities.

Families receive help they need to improve their quality of life. The parents play a key role in the Head Start center. They serve on Parent Committees and Policy Council and work as volunteers in the Head Start center.

To qualify for the Head Start Program, the child must be 3 or 4 years old. At least 90 % of the families must also meet Federal income guidelines. Families must provide proof of income, age, disability (if any), shot record and family size. TANF, foster or homeless children are automatically eligible. Children with significant disabilities are encouraged to apply.

For families with more than 8 members, add \$3,820 for each additional member.

FAMILY - means all persons living in the same household who are:
(A) supported by the income of the parent(s) or guardian(s) of the child enrolling or participating in the program; and
(B) related to the child by blood, marriage, or adoption;

GUARDIAN - means a person legally responsible for a child.

INCOME - includes total cash receipts before taxes from all sources. (Adjusted Gross Income, wages/salaries before deductions, net receipts from self-employment after deductions for business).

KI BOIS Community Action partners with many public schools to provide pre-school programs for all 4-year-old children of the community. These partnerships allow for full-day services in most cases.

The Child and Adult Care Food Program is a federal food program that provides money for serving nutritious meals to children enrolled in licensed family day care homes.

This program is funded by the U.S. Department of Agriculture (USDA) and administered at the state level by the State Department of Education, who funds organizations like KI BOIS Community Action to administer the program at the local level.

The program benefits to enrolled homes are as follows: monthly checks to cover your food costs for feeding the children in your care, you will be reimbursed for the meals your own children eat if your income is less than 185% of the poverty level, you will receive training that will improve your skills and increase your knowledge of nutrition, food preparation, and record keeping, and each child in your home will receive nutritious, tasty meals.

The Child and Adult Food program serves the following counties: Adair, Bryan, Cherokee, Coal, Craig, Delaware, Haskell, Hughes, Latimer, LeFlore, Mayes, McIntosh, Muskogee, Nowata, Ottawa, Pittsburg, Rogers, Sequoyah, Tulsa and Wagoner

The Developmental Disabilities program mission is to provide services to individuals with developmental disabilities in the least restrictive environment. Our goal is to provide supports so that the individual served can work toward living independently in the community.

KI BOIS AREA RURAL ENTERPRISES

KI BOIS Area Rural Enterprises (KARE) provides a professionally directed program for the prevocational training of individuals with developmental disabilities. KARE provides individuals with experiences that will help them to be gainfully employed. KARE has varied contracts with local businesses that provide paid work that is done in a supervised setting. Individuals in the sheltered workshop receive opportunities for socialization with peers, as well as interaction with employers and people in the community. These interactions assist with the transition to the vocational setting. Staff also assists in accessing services in the in the areas of health and daily living.

GROUP HOMES

KI BOIS Community Action currently operates seven Group Homes serving 34 adults and children with developmental disabilities. The Group Homes provide residential placements for individuals meeting the criteria set forth by DHS, DDSD Division.

Group Homes are located in McAlester, Stigler, Poteau and Wilburton.

ADULT DAYCARE

KI BOIS Community Action is currently operating an Adult Daycare in Haskell County. This provides the recipient with help in the retention or improvement of self-help and socialization skills. It's also an opportunity to interact with peers. Service is provided in a non-residential setting separate from the home or facility that the recipient resides. Services are furnished 4 or more hours per day, five days per week, to recipients over 18-years of age who require ongoing support and supervision when outside their home, and who do not pose a threat to others.

SUPPORTED EMPLOYMENT

Operation Jobs is a program designed to assist individuals with developmental disabilities in locating a job in the community. The individual is assigned a job coach who will train and assist the individual on how to do the job. The job coach will gradually fade from the individual. SUPPORTED LIVING

Supported Living provides assistance to individuals who have been mandated, by Federal Court, to move from an institutional setting to their own home in the community. Various community programs are available to assist these individuals. For more information, contact Stacy Boren at (918) 426-1355.

HABILITATION TRAINING SPECIALIST

This program is designed to assist developmentally disabled individuals who primarily reside in the community. To be eligible for the program, a person must meet the criteria for the Department of Human Services Home and Community Based Waivered Services. ADvantage CASE MANAGEMENT

KI BOIS Community Care offers certified case management for the *ADvantage* program. To be eligible, you must meet nursing home level of care and meet certain income guidelines.

The goal of the KI BOIS Community Care Program is to help consumers stay healthy, safe and independent in their own homes and communities. KI BOIS Community Care is a certified Advantage Case Management Provider serving 21 counties in southeastern Oklahoma.

The Department of Human Services determines eligibility for the Advantage Program, but KI BOIS Community Care Case Managers can assist by walking the consumer through the process.

When eligibility is determined, the consumer can receive assistance with personal care, homemaking activities, laundry, errands, equipment and supply needs, and environmental modifications (wheelchair ramps, widening of doors, etc.), if needed.

KI BOIS Community Care currently serves the following counties: Adair, Atoka, Bryan, Cherokee, Choctaw, Coal, Haskell, Hughes, Latimer, LeFlore, Marshall, McCurtain, McIntosh, Muskogee, Okfuskee, Okmulgee, Pittsburg, Pontotoc, Pushmataha, Sequoyah, and Wagoner.

LIVING CHOICE

You can have the freedom that comes with living at home even though you have a long-term illness or disability. The Oklahoma Living Choice Project can help you move out of a nursing home and back into the community.

This project gives Oklahomans like you or your loved one more options to manage your health care needs and adds more balance to the state's long-term care system.

If you live in a nursing home and qualify for SoonerCare, then Living Choice may be able to help you. This program is specifically designed for older people, those with physical disabilities and people with intellectual disabilities. Just because you live with an illness or disability doesn't mean you can't enjoy the comforts of your own home.

If you or a loved one meet requirements to qualify, then a referral can be made by an individual, a family member or a physician for this program.

Rx for Oklahoma helps Oklahomans access prescription assistance programs provided by pharmaceutical companies. Rx for Oklahoma staff will take your information including name, age, address, income, as well as prescription(s) needed and dosages(s). This information is then entered into a special database that generates the appropriate paperwork for the pharmaceutical companies for which you are eligible.

Rx for Oklahoma staff assists you with the completion of the applicants and required documentation for submission. The entire process takes approximately one month to complete so only long-term medications will qualify.

The list of medications changes often as companies adds new medications to their assistance programs. Call Rx for Oklahoma to find out if your medication is available.

Free and discounted medication assistance has been proven to be a much needed service for Oklahomans since the inception of Rx for Oklahoma on December 1st, 2005. Since then, more than 15,000 individuals have been helped across the state. Rx for Oklahoma provides better healthcare, improved medication compliance and fewer medical complications for those that qualify.

Oklahoma residents, regardless of age, who are uninsured or underinsured, are encouraged to apply. Medicare Part D and Medicaid beneficiaries with unique circumstances may qualify. Rx for Oklahoma is not an emergency service. It will take approximately four to six weeks from application to receive your medication, if you qualify.

Those wishing to apply for the program need to bring the following:

- Proof of age
- Residential Address
- Gross annual household income
- Complete list of medications you are taking and physician information
- Insurance coverage (if applicable)

Housing & Weatherization

WEATHERIZATION

This is an energy conservation program that addresses measures to help eligible families to reduce their heating and cooling costs. This program now uses the National Energy Audit Computer Program (NEAt) to determine what measures need to be done to the home. These measures include but are not limited to attic, wall and floor insulation, reducing air leakage, base load measures and heating repairs.

Potential health and safety issues will be checked prior to any work being done on the home. These issues must be corrected before KI BOIS Community Action can weatherize the home.

The program is not a storm window and door program. These items will not be put on a house, unless it is recommended by the NEAt program.

OWNER OCCUPIED REHABILITATION

This program provides funds to bring an eligible home up to Section 8 Housing Quality Standards and to meet HUD's energy efficiency goals by using Energy Star products.

Eligible families must meet these criteria: (1) Provide proof of ALL income, (2) must be a homeowner, (3) provide a copy of their deed, (4) appraisal of their property (5) provide a notarized statement that the home is their principle place of residence.

HOME BUYER EDUCATION

A one-day, six hour, workshop to provide potential homeowners with a better understanding of the steps of buying a home. This workshop uses local and state professionals to prepare future homeowners for homeownership. Topics covered include: financial literacy, budgeting, qualifying for a mortgage and preventing foreclosure.

These workshops provide information about different mortgages that are available, and programs that may offer down payment and closing cost assistance. These programs require potential homeowners to successfully complete a homebuyer education class.

KI BOIS Area Transit System (KATS) is a rural public transportation system operating a fleet of over 200 buses and vans that transport people to Head Start, Senior Citizens Centers, grocery store, doctor and school. KATS buses transport people to Senior Citizens centers, grocery stores, doctor's appointments and work. KATS also contracts with organizations to provide transportation for work and college shuttles, youth programs, or any transit need in the area. The great thing about KATS, it's available to anyone.

KATS is not fully funded and therefore has to charge for services. Costs are kept at a minimum to make access to the system easier. KATS meets the ADA requirements of public transit providers. KATS provides curb-to-curb or, based on special need, door-to-door, demand response transportation on specially equipped vehicles designed to accommodate persons with disabilities.

KATS provides a much-needed service for people who have no dependable form of transportation. It generates income in the community by transporting people to their jobs. It helps people obtain an education by taking them to college and vocational schools. KATS helps all Senior Citizens live more independently by giving them safe, dependable transportation services.

KATS provides medical trips for SoonerRide. KATS also provides a feeder service to intercity bus services located through our service area. Bus Depots are located in OKC, Shawnee, Okemah, Henryetta, Sallisaw, McAlester, Muskogee, Tulsa, Ft. Smith, AR.

KATS serves Adair, Cherokee, Haskell, Hughes, Latimer, LeFlore, McIntosh, Okmulgee, Okfuskee, Pittsburg, Sequoyah and Wagoner Counties. Services are based upon availability.

The KATS Administrative Office and Maintenance Facility is located at 1107 Industrial Road, Stigler, Oklahoma.

Domestic Violence Services

The primary purpose of the KI BOIS Community Action Women's Shelter and McAlester Care Center is to provide a 24-hour safe house for women and children in threat of physical violence. KI BOIS Community Action operates a crisis line to provide support and peer counseling to any caller who is in need of services. The line is available to those who are depressed and threatening suicide, to those who are hurt by someone at home, to sexual assault victims, to those who need information and referral, to those who need direct services from us or other agencies, and to those seeking information about issues of violence against women.

Another major purpose of the program is to provide immediate response to adult abuse victims and their children by providing safe shelter, transportation to shelter and providing education to families and the community about the issues of domestic violence and sexual assault.

The Homelessness Prevention and Rapid Re-Housing Program provides financial assistance and services to prevent individuals and families from becoming homeless and help those who are experiencing homelessness to be quickly re-housed and stabilized.

The funds under this program are intended to target individuals and families who would be homeless but for this assistance.

The funds will provide for a variety of assistance, including: short-term or medium-term rental assistance and housing relocation and stabilization services, including such activities as mediation, credit counseling, security or utility deposits, utility payments, moving cost assistance, and case management.

The Oaks Rehabilitative Services Center, certified by the Oklahoma Department of Mental Health and Substance Abuse Services and Accredited by the Commission on Accreditation for Rehabilitative Centers, provides a wide range of services in Southeastern, Eastern and Southern Oklahoma.

Alcohol and other drug problems affect between 11 and 13 percent of the population directly. People who have substance abuse problems and those affected tend to keep these problems closely guarded for many reasons. Consequences can cost money, as well as other losses. Early identification of problems areas and early outpatient treatment may avert the higher costs of residential treatment, hospitals or other health care, legal costs, loss of job and productivity and promote good family functioning. Some of the programs offered are:

Smart Start Kiamichi Country (SSKC) helps children get a better start in life. Kiamichi Country program will serve Haskell, Latimer, LeFlore and Pittsburg Counties. This is a grassroots initiative that supports families as they raise children who are safe, healthy, eager to learn and ready to succeed in school.

There are certain projects that are statewide, but since each community is different, everything is tailored to your local area. One of the statewide projects is called "Raising a Reader," which is designed to get children excited about reading. It encourages parents to read aloud to their children from the time they're born until at least the age of six. It also encourages frequent visits to the local library.

SSKC has been funded by a grant awarded to KI BOIS Community Action. Support for this project comes from the Oklahoma Partnership for School Readiness Foundation, Oklahoma Department of Health and Chesapeake Energy Corporation. This project is part of the Smart Start Oklahoma initiative. This initiative is a public/private partnership. The HALT Project

The HALT (Haskell And Latimer Tobacco) Project is a collaborative effort between Haskell and Latimer Counties, made possible by a Community of Excellence grant from the Tobacco Settlement Endowment Trust or TSET. The mission of The HALT

Project is to HALT the influence of the tobacco industry, to support community members in their effort to HALT tobacco use, to encourage youth to never start and to work towards a tobacco free environment for Haskell and Latimer County.

As the lead agency for the grant, KI BOIS Community Action was awarded the grant in September of 2010 and the Coordinator, Denice Daniels was hired in December of 2010. There is a 5 year plan in place to work on those things listed in the mission statement, and luckily, with this grant, our communities get to decide how to make those things happen here, for us, rather than someone elsewhere deciding what's best for us.

It is so important for the citizens of our community to be aware of the effects of tobacco. They need to know that tobacco is the leading cause of preventable death, killing more Oklahomans each year than alcohol, auto accidents, AIDS, murders and illegal drugs combined. Every year, 6200 Oklahomans die from tobacco and another 124,000 suffer from a serious tobacco caused disease. They also need to be aware of the fact that every 90 minutes in Oklahoma, a child becomes addicted to tobacco.



Each year KI BOIS Community Action conducts community needs surveys to determine the causes of poverty. Low-income families, business and community leaders, and elected officials rank those causes in order of severity. The KI BOIS Community Action Board of Directors then decides what programs KI BOIS Community Action will operate in the coming year.
