
CHOOSING TREATMENT

Alcohol and other drug problems affect between 11 and 13 percent of the population directly. Those affected typically have problems with one or more of the following:

- * Family and Relationship Problems
- * Social Problems
- * Legal Problems
- * Emotional and Behavioral Problems
- * Health Problems
- * Self-Esteem Problems
- * Motivational and Problem Solving Difficulty

Those indirectly affected by alcohol or drug problems include:

- * Family Members
- * Friends and Neighbors
- * Employers and Co-Workers
- * Pastors, Teachers, Service Workers

People who have substance abuse problems and those affected tend to keep these problems closely guarded for many reasons, but it is apparent to the persons affected as well as others. When situations worsen, the problem becomes more apparent.

Consequences are costly. Early identification of problem areas and early outpatient treatment promotes better family functioning and may avert the higher costs of residential treatment, hospitals or other health care, legal costs, loss of job and productivity.

The Oaks offers treatment at costs based on personal income level and family size. The Oaks also accepts insurance and Medicaid reimbursement.

The Oaks is partially funded by the Oklahoma Department of Mental Health and Substance Abuse Services. No one is turned away because of inability to pay for services.

All of the substance abuse treatment programs provided by The Oaks are co-occurring capable. Identification of clients is strictly protected by Federal and State Confidentiality Laws.

The Oaks Rehabilitative Services Center, Certified by the Oklahoma Department of Mental Health and Substance Abuse Services and Accredited by the Commission on Accreditation for Rehabilitative Centers, provides a wide range of Services in Southeastern, Eastern and Southern Oklahoma.

RESIDENTIAL SUBSTANCE ABUSE TREATMENT

Residential Treatment provides intensive treatment for adult men and women who are unable to maintain abstinence from mood altering chemicals. Consumers participate in 24 hours of therapeutic substance abuse treatment services per week in a residential setting.

RESIDENTIAL SUBSTANCE ABUSE TREATMENT FOR WOMEN WITH DEPENDENT CHILDREN

This program is designed for pregnant adult women and women with children from 0-11 years of age. This program provides 24 therapeutic hours of substance abuse treatment per week for women as well as developmental activities and counseling for their children.



HALFWAY HOUSE FOR WOMEN WITH CHILDREN

This program is designed for adult women with children from 0-11 years of age who have completed a substance abuse treatment program and need additional help maintaining abstinence. Treatment is in a residential setting and includes planned 24-hour living arrangements with at least 6 hours of therapy per week.



NON-MEDICAL DETOXIFICATION

This program is designed for adult men, adult women and women with dependent children from 0-11 years of age who need help getting through the first few days of sober living. Non-medical detoxification is provided in a social setting with trained paraprofessionals

OUTPATIENT PROGRAMS

The Oaks Rehabilitative Services Center has 5 outpatient services centers for treatment of adults and/or adolescents who need assistance with a substance abuse problem. The Oaks also provides an Early Intervention Substance Abuse Program for area schools.

AREA PREVENTION RESOURCE CENTER

The Oaks APRC provides various prevention services for Atoka, Coal, Haskell, Latimer and Pittsburg Counties targeting substance abuse prevention and related issues. The APRC also has a resource library that is free to the public.
