provides training and technical assistance for Community Action Weatherization programs and staff statewide.

Give John an idea and he runs with it. He's been the go-to man when anything needed fixing up. He put his heart and soul into making the KI BOIS Housing & Weatherization a success, and he succeeded. Let John know about someone that had a housing need and he helped. Not because it was his job, but because it is who he is.


As Jones represented housing throughout the state of Oklahoma by providing safe, decent and affordable housing, his heart represented the Promise of Community Action by improving people's lives and making America a better place to live. He was awarded the prestigious Guy Davis Leadership award in 2011 by the Oklahoma Association of Community Action Agencies, as well as a host of other awards and accolades throughout the years.

In 2019, John stepped way from Housing and Weatherization to take on a new role at KI BOIS. He became the Maintenance & Facilities Director for the agency. Since that time, he's overseen the add-on and remodel of the Board & Administration Office in Stigler, the newly constructed LeFlore County Office in Poteau and the remodeling of the Stigler Women's Shelter, Sequoyah County office and Latimer County office.

Fair has been with KI BOIS Community Action since 2007, coordinating the VITA program for the agency along with managing the data reporting of agency activities in the CAPilot system. Over the course of her 4 years with KI BOIS Community Action, Fair has grown the VITA program by at least 10% every year with 2010 tax season growing 19% with returns of over \$1.8 million dollars to clients within our service area.

Fair attended Oklahoma State University where she obtained a Bachelor of Science Degree in 1995. She is also a candidate in 2012 for National Certification as a Certified Community Action Professional.


