The year 1983 was a flagship year for KI BOIS Community Action. It was the year that a brand-new transit program was added to the services KI BOIS provided to the area.

Funding became available for rural transportation that year, and KI BOIS applied, along with 4 other programs. In addition to KI BOIS, those funded were: Little Dixie in Hugo; Call-A-Ride in Ada; Red River in Frederick; and Southwest Transit in Altus. Larry Hall wrote the grant and came up with the name: KI BOIS AREA TRANSIT SYSTEM (KATS).

The agency used seven Head Start vans to start the program during Head Start off-hours. At that time, the KI BOIS service area included Haskell, Latimer, LeFlore and Pittsburg Counties. Each county had four vans and 2 backups. Larry was named KATS Di-

rector and it was a wonderful success. Six initial drivers were hired, but as demand increased and vehicles were added, so did the number of employees.

The old Vaughn Motors in Stigler was purchased for the KATS headquarters and maintenance facility and that's when tremendous growth started. Charla Sloan became KATS Director in 1996 and has grown the program to a fleet of 236 vehicles, and the relocation of a brand-new KATS headquarters and maintenance facility in 2007.

"KATS is engrained in our communities. Charla has done a great job and the program has grown by leaps and bounds under her leadership. We got it started, but the growth has been through Sooner-Ride and work routes," said Larry Hall, KI BOIS Associate Director/COO.

Charla Sloan, KATS Director adds, "I am always proud to say I work for KI BOIS. KATS has allowed me to work with so many wonderful people. From drivers, mechanics, dispatchers, route supervisors, Director of Operations and clerks, KATS makes a difference in so many lives by providing quality transportation and that is a true blessing to me. I want to thank Carroll Huggins and our Board of Directors for entrusting me to lead this program and for supporting the growth to make KATS what it is today."
