What Is the Child & Adult Care Food Program

A Federal food program that provides money for serving nutritious meals to children enrolled in licenced family day care homes. The program is funded by the U.S. Department of Agriculture (USDA) and is administered at the state level by the State Department of Education, who funds organizations like KI BOIS Community Action to administer the program at the local level.

Program Benefits To Enrolled Homes

1. You will receive monthly checks to help cover your food costs for feeding the children in your care.
2. You will be reimbursed for the meals your own children eat with the day care children if your income is 185% of the poverty level or less
3. You will received training that will improve your skills and increase your knowledge of nutrition, food preparation and record keeping.
4. Each child in your home will received nutritious tasty meals.
5. Minute Menu (optional)
6. Direct Deposit (optional)

How Much Money Can You Receive For Serving A Child Breakfast, Lunch & Snack

	Tier 1	Tier 2
Breakfast	\$1.65	\$.59
Snack	\$.93	\$.25
Lunch / Supper	\$3.12	\$1.88

For one month, you can receive per child:
Tier 1 ----- \$119.70 ----- based on 21 days
Tier 2 ----- \$ 57.12 ----- based on 21 days
*** Subject to increase each July ***

What Are Some Other Family Day Care Providers Responsibilities?

- To annual have your home approved.
- To maintain proper records of menus, attendance and enrollment of children served each day.
- Whole Grain 1 times daily.
- To participate in sponsor training sessions on menu planning and record keeping
- Juice 1 time daily - No juice for infant

Is This Income Taxable?

The portion of the reimbursement which covers your food costs is not taxable. The remaining portion is considered payment for your labor and is taxable. If your food costs exceed your reimbursement, then the excess is considered a business expense and is tax deductible.
